WHO CAN APPLY?

Youth-led programs are opportunities created by individuals and organizations where youth lead planning decision-making, facilitation, reflection and evaluation on issues that matter to them using actions that are youth led. Adults can act in supportive ways through youth/adult partnerships.

Youth led organizations must:

- Have youth ranging from ages 10 18,
- Have 3 or more members ,
- Be majority youth members,
- Be a 501c(3) organization
- Have youth engaged in primary leadership of the organization and must be involved in the decision making, implementation and evaluation process of the organization, and
- Have an adult sponsor

HOW TO APPLY:

- **Step 1:** Review the application to ensure you and your project meet the grant criteria for HYC grant funding.
- Step 2: Read the four (4) grant "Youth Issues" (page 4), and select the one your group is most interested in working to solve. Develop a project idea that you think will really make a difference. Projects will be funded UP TO \$2500.
- Step 3: (Recommended but not required) Attend the 'Applicant Interest Meeting' to learn how to write a successful proposal. By attending, there is no guarantee your proposal will be selected for a grant, but the information will be helpful when filling out the application. - **Step 4:** Complete the enclosed Grant Application.

YOUTH GRANT SELECTION CRITERIA

1. To qualify for funding:

- Projects <u>must</u> be planned and implemented by youth led organizations.
- Proposed projects <u>must</u> identify one of the grant funding "Youth Issues" on page 4.
- Projects <u>must</u> benefit Hampton youth.
- Sponsoring organization must be able to establish accounting procedures to document
 the expenditure of funds. All expense receipts must be saved and turned in at the end
 of the project.
- Must be a 501c(3) organization
- Projects must be completed by April 30th 2021. Should your program or project have a longer lifespan, please contact our office before applying.
- Final report is due April 30th 2021

2. Grant money MAY be used for the following:

Supplies, materials, youth stipends, and other expenses that are directly involved with your project and are necessary to making it a success.

3. Grant money MAY NOT be used for:

- Religious instruction or conducting worship services
- Capital expenses (i.e. major equipment...computers, copiers, furniture, etc...unless proven to contribute to the on-going life of the proposed program)
- Monetary donations to other organizations
- Salaries
- Travel outside of Hampton Roads

4. If you are approved for funding, you must:

- Have an adult partner sign a funding and services contract
- Be available for one site visit made by the funding staff of HYC.
- Document your project through pictures or/video and submit a final report on the project following pre-determined guidelines of the Commission.

HYC has been placed in a position of responsibility for these funds provided by the City of Hampton. We are committed to the success of our grant program.

Comprehensive Plan 'Youth Issue' Areas

Youth are Prepared

What young person has not been asked, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" During this time of contemplation, young people should be given opportunities to learn about, explore, and even prepare for potential careers. Proposals addressing this issue include strategies that expose youth to a variety of careers, and options for a productive and meaningful future. Youth talk about how they can't wait to become adults, but at the same time, express concerns that they don't have the knowledge and skills to enter the 'real world'. Things like credit cards, job interviews and renting your first apartment can seem overwhelming! Grant proposals addressing this issue should work to provide youth opportunities to develop these essential 'life skills' that will prepare them for adulthood.

Youth are Active

Youth frequently express their increasing disappointment in the amount of activities available to them. By either creating or introducing opportunities to youth, we hope to encourage youth to be more active in their communities. Being active also includes chances to engage in community restoration or service. To become more involved with the work in their community, will foster a lasting relationship that bolsters a love for the community. Grant proposals addressing this issue should focus on providing ways for youth to actively engage themselves or others in the community.

Youth are Returning

Like many students graduating from high school, Hampton youth often leave for college. What happens after college, though, is a critical issue for the future of our city. Do young people return to live and work in Hampton, contributing as citizens and tax payers, or do they move away? Grant proposals addressing this issue should include strategies that encourage young adults to 'come back' to Hampton, and help grow our city into greatness.

Youth are Respected

The Youth Commission believes that young people should have a voice in the decisions that affect them, and that they should have a role as citizens in solving community problems and making Hampton stronger. Grant proposals addressing this issue will work to fully engage young people as leaders in our community...

Caring relationships not just for one day, but for a lifetime!

Relationships are present throughout Hampton, and, if positive, are vital to the healthy development of young people. Grant proposals addressing this issue should work to bridge relationships 'gaps' and/or build caring relationships between young people, or between different groups of youth and adults.
