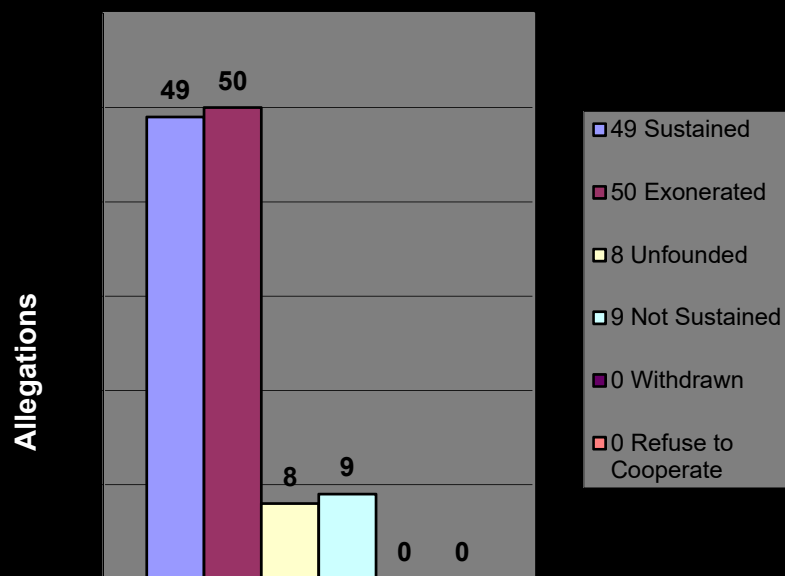


FINDINGS CHART

2016 - 2018

2016

A total of 50 complaints were received in 2016. Of those 30 were citizen initiated and 20 were internal.



DEFINITION OF FINDINGS

Sustained: Misconduct is substantiated. Misconduct may be as stated in complaint or as a result of investigation.

Exonerated: Incident occurred, officer acted lawfully and properly.

Unfounded: Incident cited in complaint is falsely reported or not factual.

Not Sustained: Insufficient evidence exists to prove or disprove complaint.

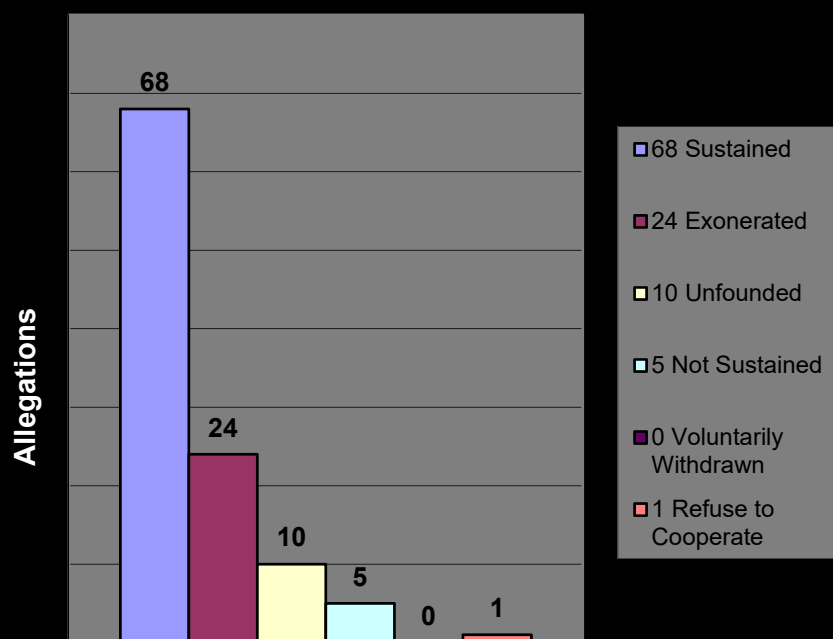
Voluntarily Withdrawn: Complainant decided not to pursue the original allegation(s) and requested the case file be closed and not investigated further.

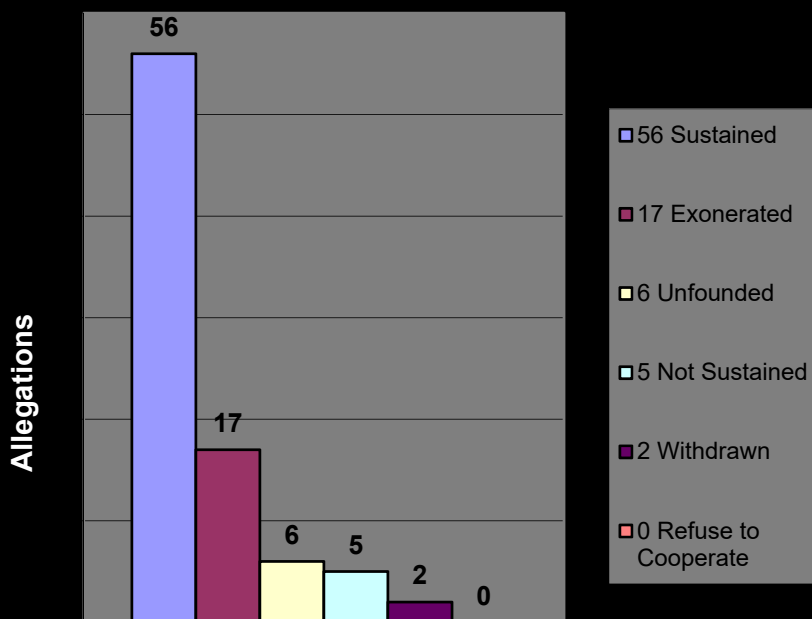
